- 2. What scenes from the novel do you think would work particularly will in a film version? Why?
- 3. What scenes from the novel do you think should be omitted? How could a filmmaker/screenwriter work around these omissions?
- 4. Film is more than visual imagery. Think about a key scene in the novel (one of conflict or great intensity). What music would you use to bring the scene to life? Why?
- 5. What actors and actresses do you think would be good in a film version of TEWWG? Why?
- 6. What key objects or details in the novel do you think must be included in a film version? Why?

Post-Viewing Questions

- 7. What is you overall rating of the film? Why?
- 8. What pleased you the most about the film? Explain.
- 9. What disappointed you the most about the film? Explain.
- 10. Compare the music used in the film with the music you thought about using in your pre0viewing response. Did you like the filmmaker's musical decision? Why or why not?
- 11. If you could interview Oprah, any of the actors/actresses, the screenwriter, and/or the director, what questions would you ask them about their experience with the film version of TEWWG? Explain.
- Choose a scene from the film in which you think the cinematic techniques (camera angles, voice-over, camera shots, etc.) were particularly important and interesting. Explain your impressions.
